If you have difficulty with the vowel sound indicated, in the sample words, put an "x" in the rectangualr box for that sound. Additionally, some common **PROBLEM SOUNDS** for a person from **FRANCE** will be indicated for you by **LETTERS IN PURPLE**. For more in-depth evaluation of Vowel Sounds, study the Vowel Sheets handout found in the handout sections of the Foreign Accent Modification Course or the American English Consonants Pronunciation Course from this website.)

Some Common **PROBLEM LANGUAGE ERRORS** for a person from **FRANCE** will be indicated for you by **WORDS IN PURPLE**.

Be sure and learn when to pronounce the "t" versus the "th" sounds, so that you correctly say "patio" and not "pathio."

Be sure that all FINAL POSITION Consonant sounds are put on the ends of words. In particiular, the "I" sound needs to be prolonged, slightly, to be correct.

Review plural words which stay the same for "one" or "more than one," such as "fish." There is no proper English word of "fishes."

Review the appropriate stress of words to know how to pronounce them when they are a noun, subject of a sentence or when they are a verb, predicate of a sentece, for example the word "address."

Pay attention to how words are "reduced," certain syllables eliminated, when spoken in American English so that the word "chocolate" should be pronounced "choclit."

Review the basic stress rules for sentences.
