Some Common PROBLEM LANGUAGE ERRORS for a person from a SPANISH SPEAKING BACKGROUND will be indicated for you by WORDS IN PURPLE.

Be sure that all FINAL POSITION Consonant sounds are put on the ends of words. In particiular, the "I" sound needs to be prolonged, slightly, to be correct.

Be sure and learn to use the "short i" sound so that you do not say "seat" for "sit," as in the sentence, "Please sit down."

Be sure asnd learn to use the "ch" sound, as you sit in a "chair" not in a "share."

Review plural words which stay the same for "one" or "more than one," such as "fish." There is no proper English word of "fishes."
